## HIGH SCHOOL HEAD TIMER

The Meet Referee will meet with the Starter, Head Timer and timers to give instructions regarding their responsibilities, positioning, clearing of watches, timing and recording times. After the meeting with the Meet Referee the Starters and Head Timers will meet with the lane timers to give instructions regarding responsibilities, positioning, clearing of watches, timing and recording procedures. It is requested to emphasize to the timers that they are acting as meet officials and, as such, they should be unbiased during all races.

$\square$ Batteries for Watches
$\square$ Extra paper (or notecards just in case to write times)

## Notes for Double Dual Meets

Dual Meets automatic timing: The assignments are one timer in each lane with a second timer in the lane. Total of 12 timers per team. So, if you are home team swimming in the even lanes you supply the second timer in the odd lanes and vice versa.

The assignment sheet for a double meet (called a double dual - 4 teams with $A \& B$ ) is provided above. Each team supplies 6 timers with the assignments as shown based on Home/Away and A meet vs. B meet.

Of course Colgan and Freedom are ten lane pool and the outside lanes are used as exhibition we try least two timers (in a double dual it should be easy to have 3). Note: Smaller teams have a difficult time manning that many lanes.

## Events

Event names and event numbers should be written on each card. See chart below. In VHSL, events \#9-10 are diving events which we do not have so we skip over those numbers.

Medley Relays:
